### Our Mission:

### **Strategic Direction**





The opening weeks of the 2012-2013 fiscal year saw us in an apparent fight for our very life as an organization, after disastrous budget changes were pushed through in the final minutes of the 2012 legislative session. Almost in the blink of an eye, state programs that had for years buoyed quality for thousands of Missouri children were gone: Accreditation Facilitation, gone; Early Head Start-Child Care Partnerships, gone; support for stay-at-home parents, gone; grants to start-up or expand new spaces for infants and toddlers, gone. Parents As Teachers sliced to a third of its former funding, and the Missouri Preschool Project left with remnants of its former funding, which also eliminated state funding for our T.E.A.C.H. MISSOURI program.

Together with our regional agencies—Council of Churches of the Ozarks in Southern Missouri, the LUME Institute in Eastern Missouri, and The Family Conservancy in Western Missouri—and other partners like Missouri Head Start Association, First Chance for Children, and Missouri Coalition of Children's Agencies, we rose up and shouted, "NOT ON OUR WATCH!"

Our advocacy efforts with these partners gained additional traction from other activities across the state. Columbia voters passed a special sales tax levy to generate \$6.5 million annually for children and youth. Governor Nixon publicized early care and education in his inaugural address. A public awareness campaign in St. Louis engaged the community with the *Are You Smarter than a Preschooler* quiz? Kansas City business leaders partnered with associates in other communities to advance early care. Springfield began development of its *Every Child Promise* initiative. The Missouri Chamber of Commerce and Industry elevated early education in its policy platform.

Within this landscape, in which so much had been lost, the Child Care Aware<sup>®</sup> of Missouri Board of Directors began development of a new strategic plan. We celebrated our history and also turned in new directions, seeking to simultaneously retain the best of what we have been and build a new vision for our future work. The results included:

- First-time funding for T.E.A.C.H. MISSOURI from the PNC Bank Foundation
- A prestigious opportunity for national pilot funding from the Centers for Disease Control, to implement *Taking Steps for Healthy Success*, a program to promote healthy environments and policies at early care and education centers
- Addition of new assets to the database we use to help families find programs for their children
- Publication of our first report on the supply of early care and education in Missouri
  - More community requests for our data, and more requests from first-time users
  - The validation of our success through a 100%-compliance monitoring of our Department of Social
