## Still Having Trouble Finding Care?



Two-Thousand Days to Make a Difference

If you are having a difficult time finding child care that meets your family's needs, consider the following:

- Search in a different location. There may not be programs in the area where you live, but there could be options available near your work, school, etc.
- 2. Talk to friends, family members, and neighbors.
  Check with your local library, church, or community center. They may have information about who provides child care in your area.
- 3. Contact local schools or universities. They may be able to connect you with people who care for children in your community.



- 4. *Get on the waiting list* at every program that could work for you in case an opening becomes available.
- 5. Consider asking a friend, neighbor, or family member to become a registered provider. This individual must complete a Registered Child Care Provider Agreement with the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education to provide child care to subsidy-eligible children.
